Overseas Filipino Workers

The Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) are considered as the modern day economic heroes. With more than 10 million Filipinos working overseas, their remittances account for 8.5% of the gross domestic product. In the 2015 survey by the Philippine Statistics Authority, one out of three OFWs are unskilled, and worked as domestic workers, cleaners or in the service sectors. As female workers outnumber the male workers, mostly aged from 24-29 years old, they are at the most vulnerable to abuses, including financial abuses. There is currently no system available that will prevent these abuses, besides victims reporting these said abuses themselves.

People will then know which companies to avoid due to low ratings. Also, the smart contract will automatically report the agencies/employers who have failed to follow the contract.
Contract management	1.No one monitors if the contract is followed2.Long process of trial	Smart Contracts will automatically reduce the ratings of people/companies who have failed to follow the contract.
